



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

SH 14 (MULBERRY STREET) - PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE REMOVAL AND TEMPORARY PEDESTRIAN / BICYCLE DETOUR ROUTE

Q: Why is a pedestrian / bicycle detour route needed?

A: In order to construct Phase 2 of the SH 14 (Mulberry Street) bridge replacement project, the existing two-span pedestrian bridge over the Cache la Poudre River and adjacent to the south side of Mulberry Street, will be removed and relocated. The north side of Mulberry Street, west of the SH 14 work zone, lacks sidewalk near the railroad tracks and Riverside Avenue. In addition, the northwest corner of Mulberry Street / Lemay Avenue is still an active construction zone; the sidewalk between Lemay and the new bridge is not complete. Therefore, another pedestrian route is required until Phase 2 bridge improvements are complete.

Q: Who will be impacted by the pedestrian bridge removal and temporary sidewalk closure?

A: All Mulberry Street pedestrians and cyclists that would normally use the pedestrian bridge adjacent to the south side of Mulberry Street. A signed detour route will be provided.

Q: What is the detour route?

A: The signed detour route utilizes Riverside Avenue and Lemay Avenue to travel around the work zone. The Poudre River Trail through the Woodward property (northwest corner of Mulberry Street / Lemay Avenue intersection) is also an alternative route.

Q: How long will the pedestrian / bicycle detour be in place?

A: From February 16, 2015 until the south side of the new bridge is completed in late Fall 2015.

Q: Is the Poudre River Trail impacted?

A: The Poudre River Trail remains open near the SH 14 work zone. Since October 2014, a signed detour has been in place to direct trail users to cross SH 14 at the Mulberry Street / Lemay Avenue intersection since the portion of the trail that provides access underneath the SH 14 (Mulberry Street) bridge is closed during construction.
