Project Update: Week ending May 28, 2016 **Love Your Valley Festival**

This weekend kicks off a series of summer events held in the heart of Ridgway at Hartwell Park!

The Love Your Valley Festival will take place this Saturday from 1pm-6pm.

Are you ready for the weekend? ACC's work today is all about getting ready for the weekend as we assure the city streets are accessible for the Love your Valley Festival. Parking will be available at the new parking lot at SH62 & Railroad Street and the lot at the intersection of Laura and Clinton Streets. Additional parking throughout town is available but limited on the second street of North Lena Street. Please encourage folks to respect construction fencing and cones as they are placed to identify hazards and protect completed work. And, if you see a hazard you feel has not been appropriately marked please let us know.

After that fun is done, here is what to expect next week as we move forward. . .

Ridgway will have its first paved roads by the end of the day on Thursday. Crews will be doing preparation work in the second block of North Lena on Monday and Tuesday requiring intermittent traffic holds shorter than 5 minutes. This will be followed by the paving of North Lena Wednesday and Thursday from SH 62 to Clinton Street. This will also require flagger initiated traffic holds.

Crews will begin locating utilities by potholing on Monday so we can start excavation on Clinton Street from Lena to Cora. Lena and Cora intersections will remain open next week until after Memorial day at which time the Cora/Clinton intersection will be closed. Construction on Cora will continue west to Laura and is scheduled to be complete by June 8th. There will be no construction from Friday May 27 thru May 30 for Memorial Day weekend. The only street that will be closed during that weekend will be Clinton Street from Lena to Cora.

Thank you for your continued support as we finish up the post office access. Parking at Town Hall is recommended until paving is complete on Lena this upcoming Thursday. Pedestrians should stay out of the work zone. Your safety and the safety of our workers is our priority. Please follow the direction of the flaggers at all times and do not cross construction zones.
