



## Subcontractor picking up debris from US 34 corridor

The Colorado Department of Transportation has contracted with a debris removal firm to help residents in the Big Thompson Canyon dispose of various types of materials being removed from homes during flood cleanup efforts.

The contractor is currently scheduled to remove debris at the following times:

- Tuesday, Nov. 26
- Wednesday, Nov. 27
- Approximately the week of December 9 (TBD)
- Approximately the week of December 23 (TBD)

Residents who have debris they would like picked up should place it right alongside the US 34 right-of-way (just off the pavement next to the highway). Crews will not access private property or county roads to pick up materials, so residents will need to place any debris right along the edge of US 34 to have it removed.

## What will be picked up

<u>Household hazardous waste</u>: Paints, cleaners, solvents, propane tanks, petroleum products, etc.

<u>White waste</u>: Appliances such as refrigerators, stoves, washers & dryers, hot water heaters, dishwashers and microwave ovens

<u>Electronic waste</u>: Computers, televisions, DVD players and telephones

Vegetation waste: Branches, plants, trees and grass

<u>Construction & demolition waste</u>: Wood framing from houses, furniture, carpet. clothes, concrete, etc.

Car waste: Car parts including batteries

## What will not be picked up

Household garbage including food waste. This should be disposed of in your dumpsters and removed by your waste management provider.
