



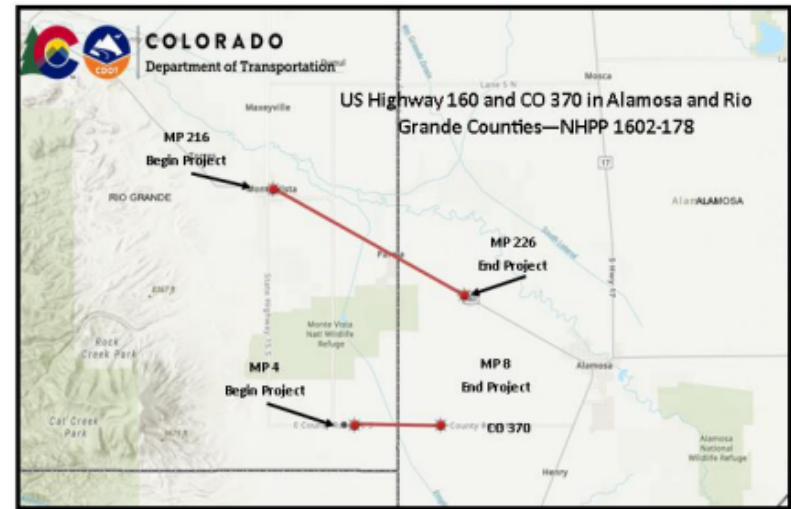
US160 East of Monte Vista

What Work is Being Done?

Crews have completed work on CO 370. This week crews **continue** paving eastbound on US 160 at County Road 2 E near the Monte Vista Coop. Crews will also be doing work at the Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) Pedestrian Crosswalk Systems at Lyell Street in Monte Vista on US 160. Motorists will encounter alternating single-lane closures as they travel through the work area. Work hours will be 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM. Speed reductions down to 40 mph can be expected as motorists come into project work areas. Flagging Personnel will be onsite due to alternating single lane closures. Expect up to 10-minute traffic delays.

Why is the work being completed?

This project is part of CDOT's "Whole System. Whole Safety." initiative aimed at enhancing safety for Colorado's traveling public. Once the resurfacing work is completed, drivers will find a smoother roadway surface with new guardrail, new signage, high visibility markings and stabilized shoulders. These enhancements will make the highway safer for residents, visitors and commercial truck traffic.

When will crews be working? Work will take place during daylight hours, 7am to 7pm, Monday through Friday. Night work and weekend work are not anticipated at this time and all business and residence access may be temporarily altered but will remain open.

Travel Impacts

- Alternating single lane closures on US 160 in the Town of Monte Vista as crews work to pave the roadway.
- Flagging personnel be on sight to direct travelers as the speed limit will be reduced to 40 mph while working in in town during daylight hours.
