



## US 385 Resurfacing North of Cheyenne Wells

### PROJECT OVERVIEW

Starting in early September, the Colorado Department of Transportation will begin resurfacing a sixteen-mile stretch of U.S. Highway 385 north of Cheyenne Wells into Kit Carson county. Work includes milling and paving the first 12 miles of highway followed by full depth reclamation and resurfacing of the remaining 4 miles. Other work includes shoulder widening, installing guardrail and signs, and striping.

### SCHEDULE & LOCATION

The project is located on US 385 north of Cheyenne Wells in Cheyenne County and extends for 16 miles into Kit Carson County. The work zone begins at Mile Point 156.8 and ends at MP 172.7. The project will start in early September and is expected to last until mid-December. Work will be performed during daytime hours Monday to Friday with some weekend work expected.

### TRAFFIC IMPACTS

Single lane closures will be in place in both directions of US 385 through the work zone from project kickoff through completion. Flaggers will be present to direct traffic through the single lane configurations. Business and residential access will be maintained. Construction devices, reflective cones and signs will exist to maintain safety. All construction schedules are weather dependent and subject to change.

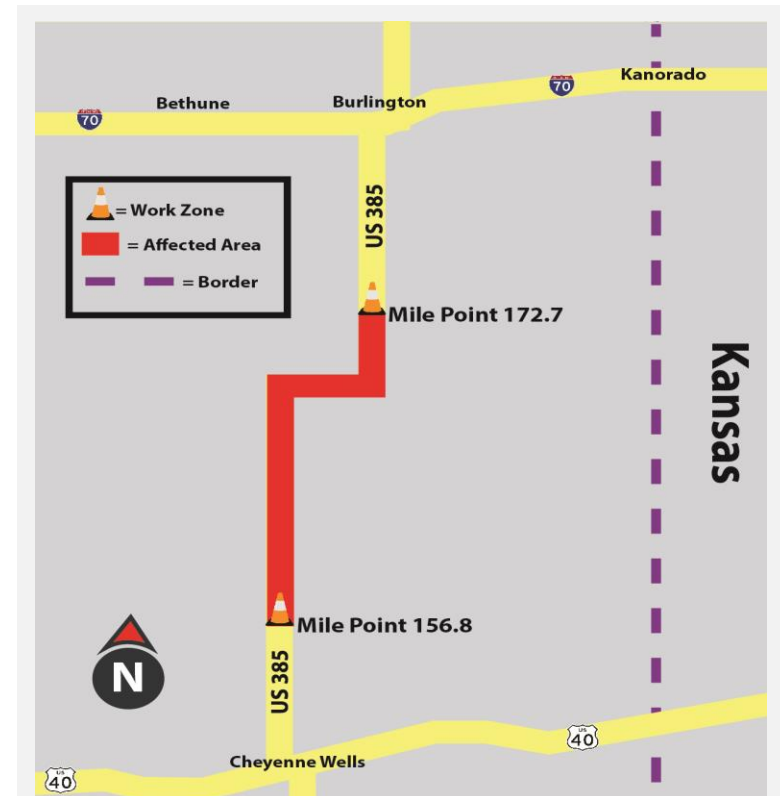
