MESA COUNTY - The Colorado Department of Transportation and contractor United Companies have shut down work on the resurfacing project on US Highway 6/North Avenue in Grand Junction for the winter.

The shutdown began Thurs., Dec. 22 at 10 p.m. Project crews expect to return to the work zone in spring 2023 to complete profiling, grinding, minor corrective work, and permanent final striping. The remaining work will take approximately two to four weeks. The project will complete this work in spring 2023 due to winter climate conditions that are not conducive to completing quality work safely.

Once complete, the project will improve the drivability for motorists on this busy thoroughfare in Mesa County. Project work includes access improvements with raised median curb replacement and installation, ADA ramp construction, curb, gutter and sidewalk improvements. Improvements completed in 2022 include: full-width overlay paving of this four-mile stretch of highway, traffic signal conduit improvements, and drainage, signage and striping.

The project is part of CDOT's 10-year plan. It is one of several CDOT roadway improvement projects along the US 6 corridor in Mesa County during the 2022-2023 construction season.
