

CDOT has a major funding shortfall, which impacts funding large projects such as the planned improvements at the I-70/Kipling Interchange.

The interchange reconstruction project would have been funded by Proposition 110, which was rejected by voters in November 2018. This project will now be competing for funding with several other major project needs across the region.



Despite the funding shortfall, it is important to keep this project moving forward. Completing the Environmental Assessment and preliminary design will:

- Build and document support of all involved local agencies;
- Continue transparency and engagement with local community regarding plans impacting and benefiting them;
- Allow early action improvements and phased implementation to begin;
- Provide benefit, impact, and cost information to better compete for project funding in the region; and
- Position project to progress quickly once funding is identified.
