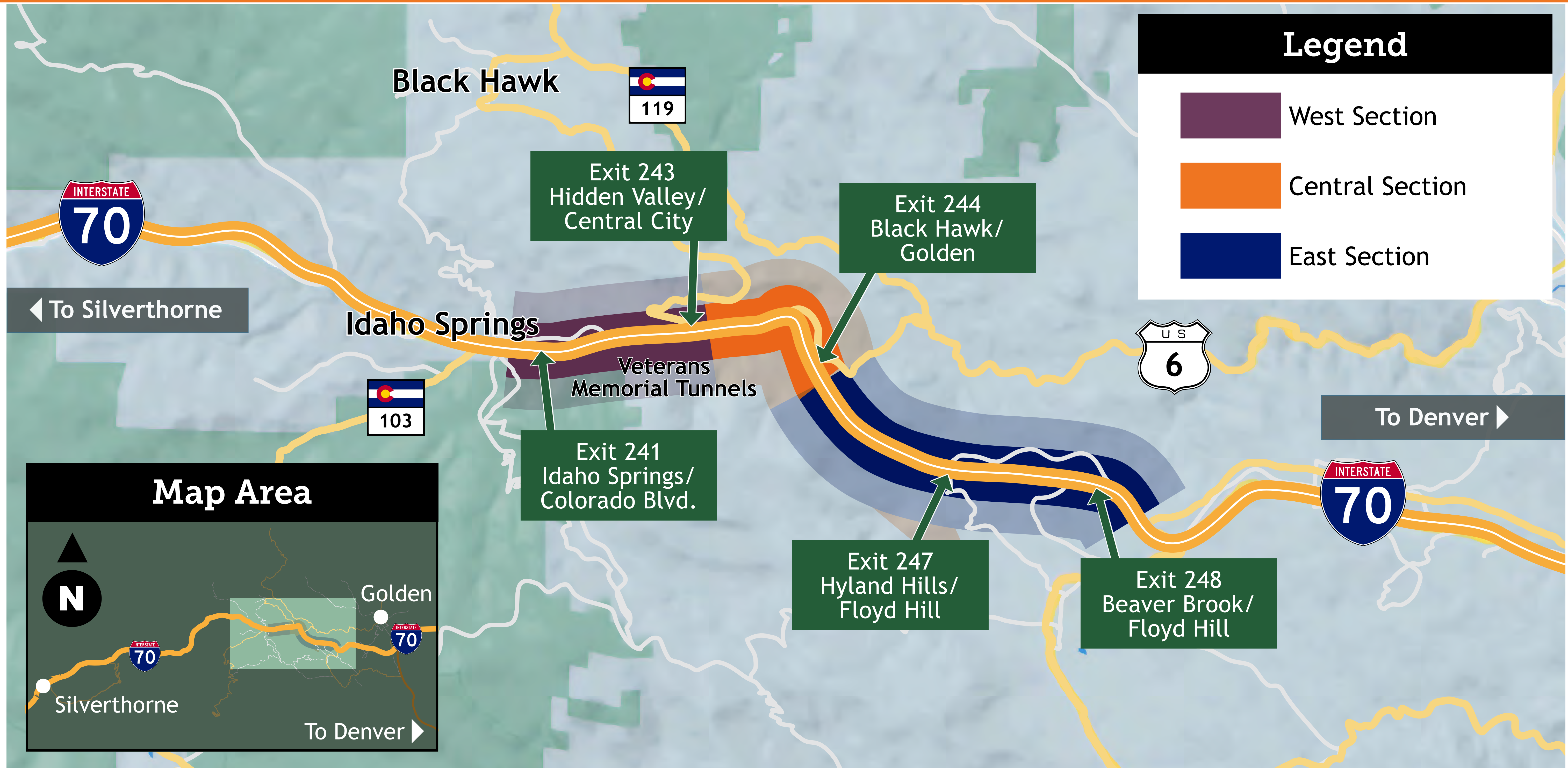

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Need for This Project



Long and Unreliable Travel Times

Congestion negatively impacts local and state economies; decreases commuter, traveler and freight mobility; increases crashes and hinders emergency response. This project will address the bottleneck along I-70 at Floyd Hill and improve travel time reliability.



Aging Infrastructure

The I-70 Floyd Hill bridge above Clear Creek needs to be replaced due to age, wear and tear, and heavy usage. This project will rebuild bridges to today's safety standards.



Safety Concerns

The lack of a parallel route to I-70 between US 6 and Idaho Springs hinders emergency response times. This project will build a frontage road between US 6 and Hidden Valley/Central City Parkway and straighten curves to improve safety.





Project features include:

- Adding a third westbound I-70 travel lane in this two-lane bottleneck. This new lane will be a full-time, tolled Express Lane.
- Constructing a missing two-mile section of the frontage road between US 6 and the Hidden Valley/Central City Parkway interchange.
- Adding an extended on-ramp from US 6 to eastbound I-70, giving trucks room to merge.
- Improving traffic flow and access at interchanges and intersections.
- Straighten curves on I-70 to improve safety and achieve a 55 mph design speed.

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Environmental and Recreational Improvements

Project features include:

- Improving the Clear Creek Greenway trail.
- Enhancing wildlife movements under bridges and along Clear Creek.
- Installing wildlife fencing to reduce wildlife-vehicle collisions.
- Monitoring air and water quality.
- Improving stream and riparian conditions for fish, wildlife, and recreational users.
- Providing noise mitigation for residential properties in eastern Idaho Springs.

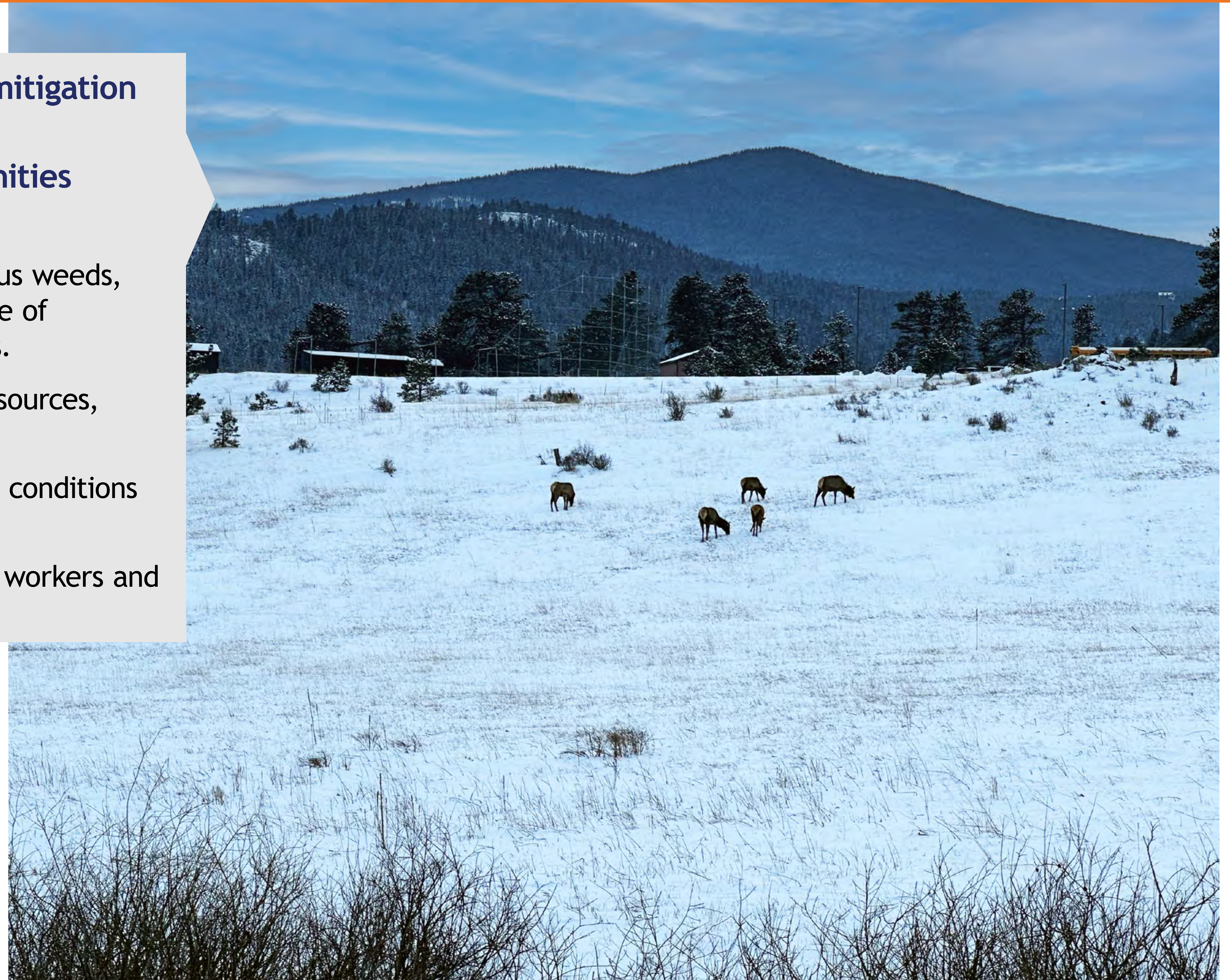


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Environmental Construction Mitigations

The project includes more than 100 mitigation commitments to minimize impacts to environmental resources and communities during construction, including:

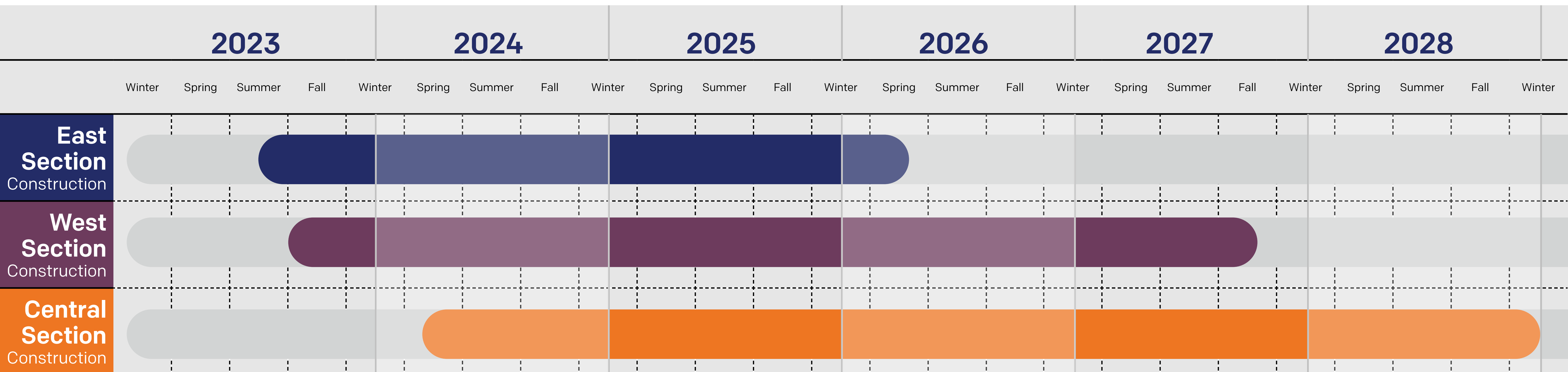
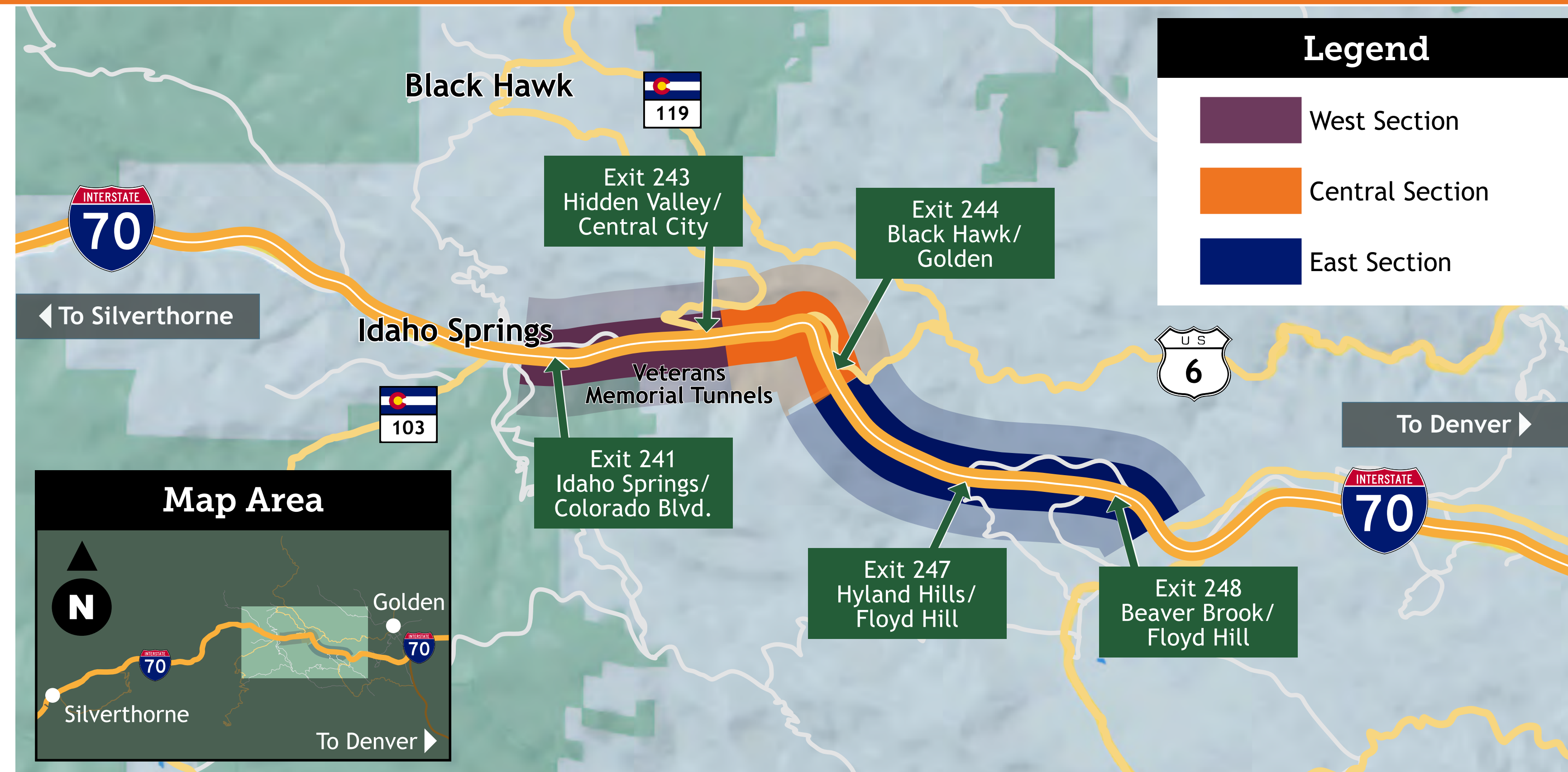
- Minimizing dust, stormwater runoff, noxious weeds, vehicle emissions, lighting, and disturbance of contaminated sites or hazardous materials.
- Protecting sensitive water and wetland resources, such as fencing, no-work zones, etc.
- Installing air quality monitors and tracking conditions during construction.
- Mitigating rockfall to protect construction workers and motorists, such as mesh, netting, etc.





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Floyd Hill Construction Timeline





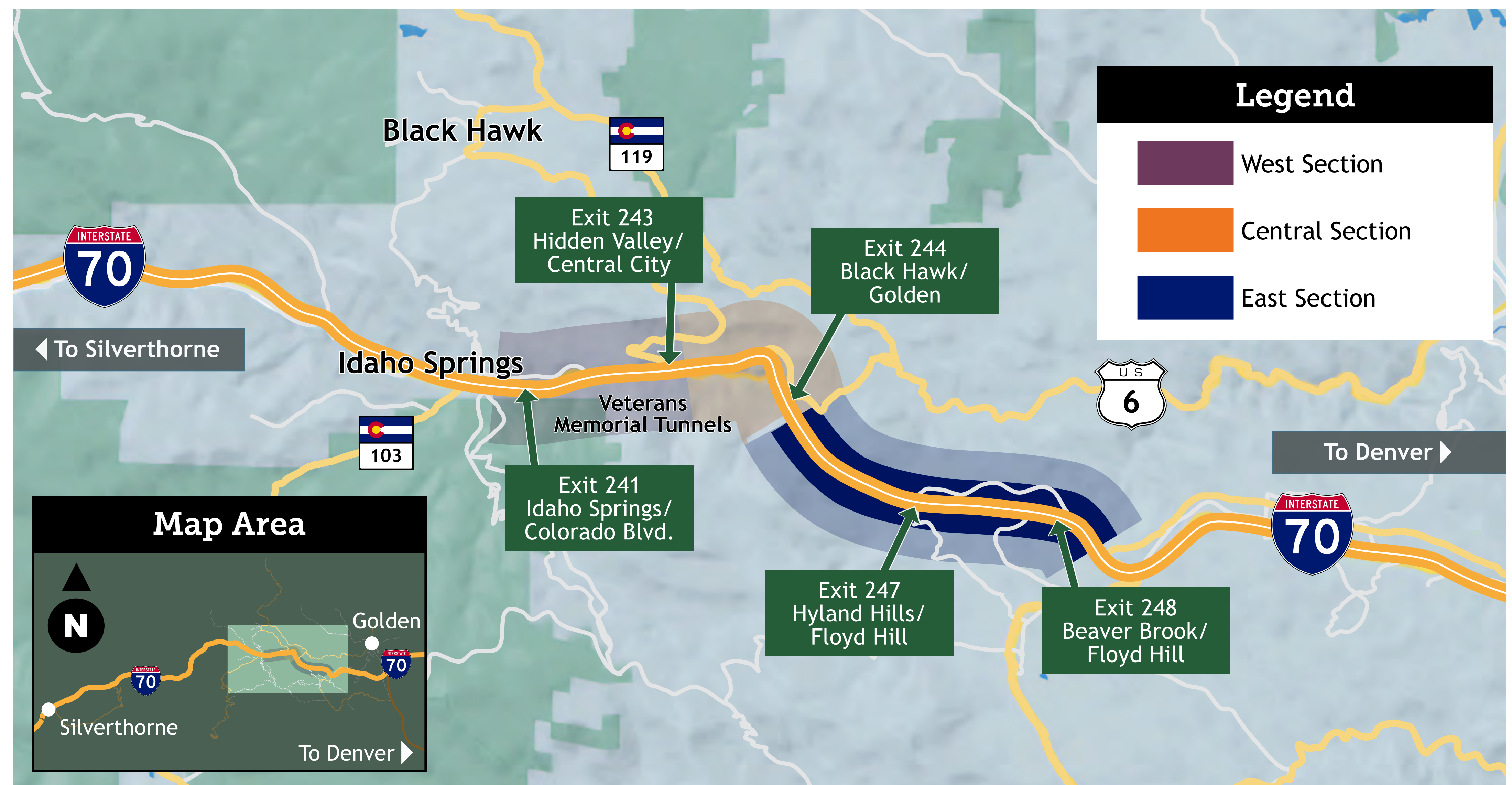
Overview:

- Improve operations by adding an extended on-ramp from US 6 to eastbound I-70, giving trucks room to merge.
- Improve drainage and add water quality features.
- Build a third travel lane on westbound I-70 that will operate as a full-time, tolled Express Lane from the top of Floyd Hill to the Veterans Memorial Tunnels.
- Install wildlife fencing between Hyland Hills/Floyd Hill (Exit 247) and Soda Creek Road (east of Exit 248).

East Section

(CR 65 to bottom of Floyd Hill)

Construction start: Early summer 2023



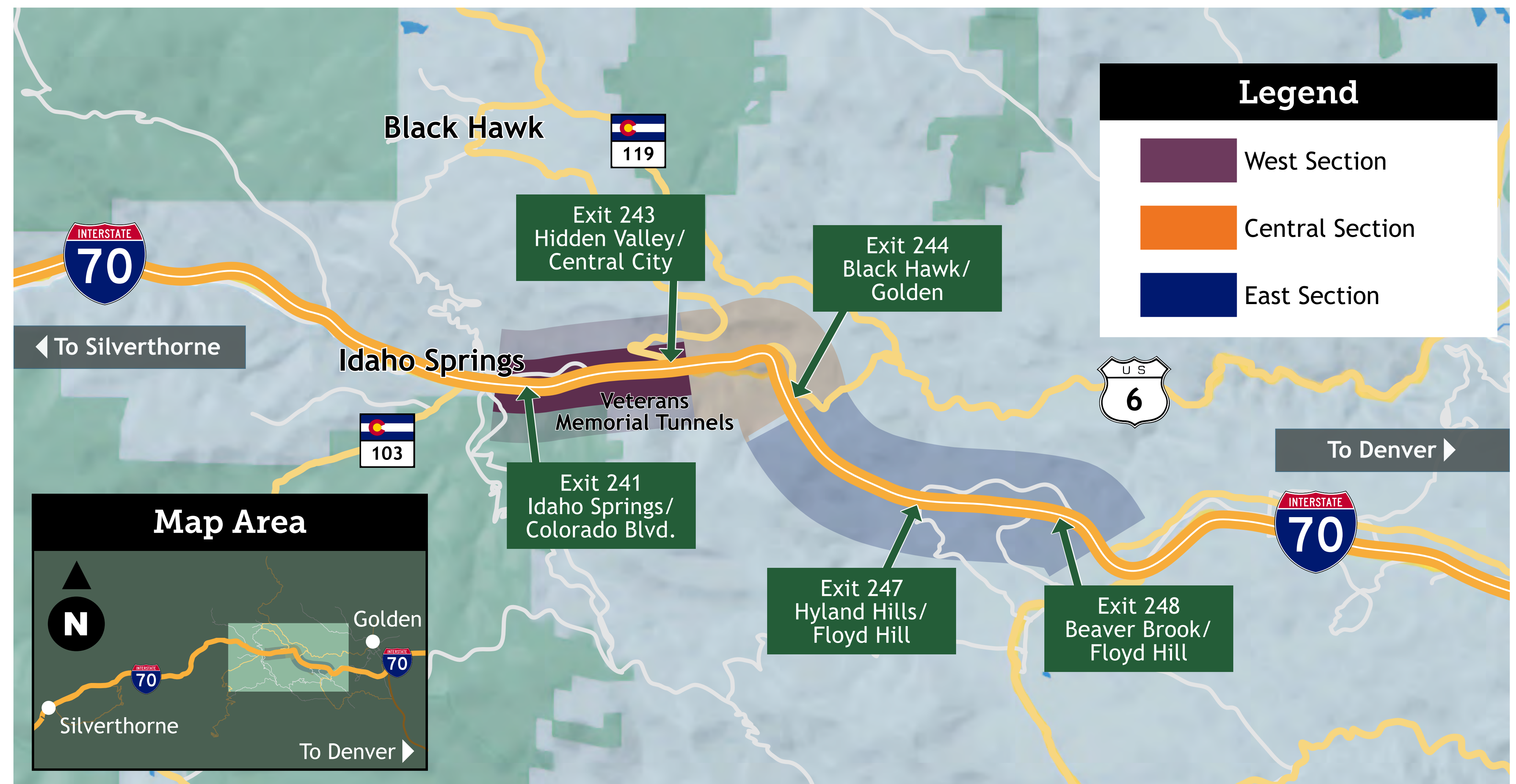


Overview:

- Construct the westbound I-70 Express Lane through the Veterans Memorial Tunnels to Idaho Springs/Colorado Blvd. (Exit 241).
- Straighten I-70 curves to improve safety and achieve a 55 mph design speed.
- Rebuild the bridges over Clear Creek, just west of Hidden Valley.
- Resurface/reconstruct the Clear Creek Greenway trail from the Hidden Valley interchange to the Veterans Memorial Tunnels.
- Install a noise wall east of Idaho Springs at Idaho Springs/Colorado Blvd. (Exit 241).
- Avoids impacts to County Road 314, which will remain open during construction.

West Section (Hidden Valley to Idaho Springs)

Construction start: Fall 2023





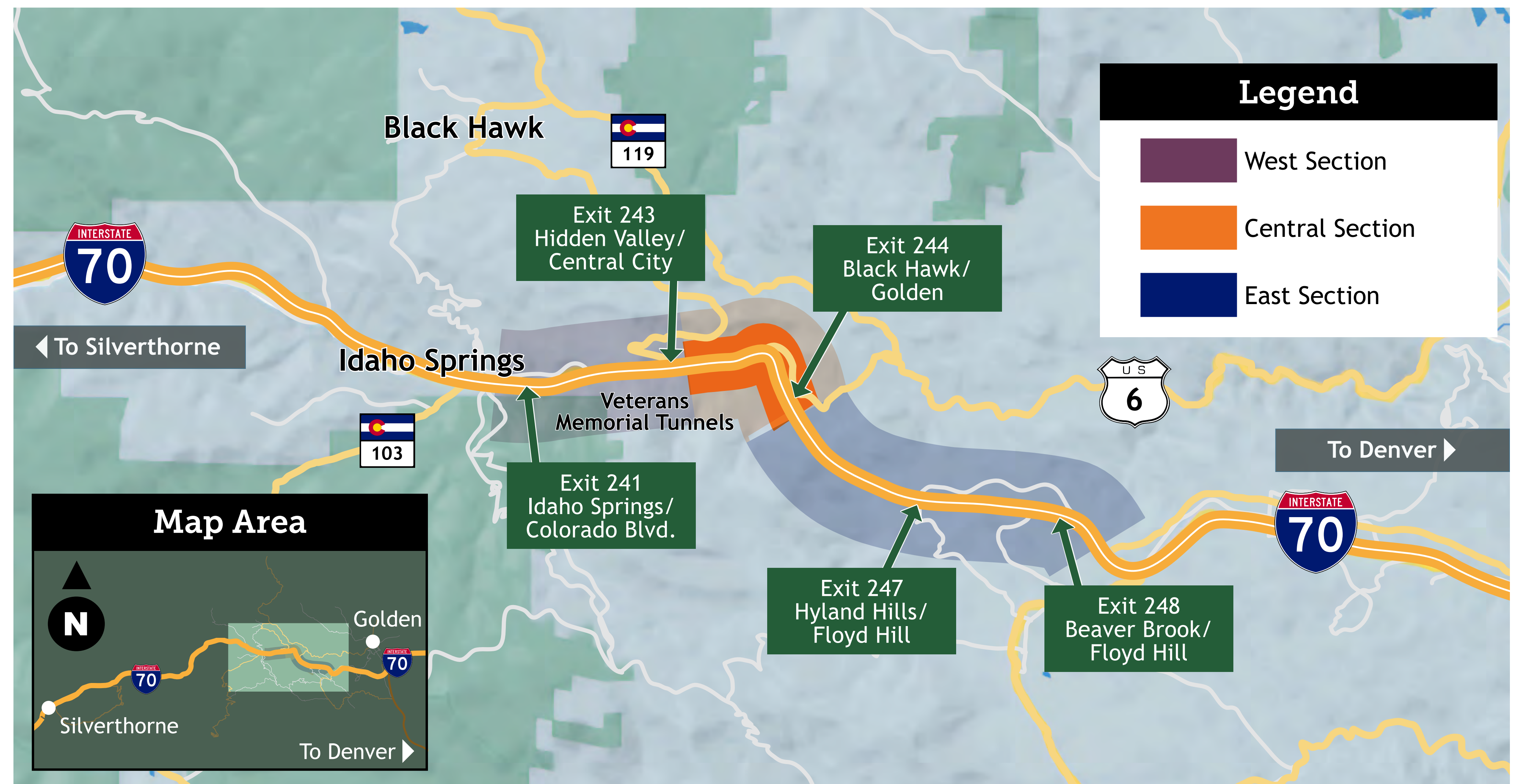
Overview:

- Complete construction of the westbound I-70 Express Lane.
- Elevate I-70 above Clear Creek Canyon.
- Straighten curves on I-70 to improve safety and achieve a 55 mph design speed.
- Construct a new on-ramp to eastbound I-70 from the bottom of Floyd Hill/US 6, which will connect to the new eastbound I-70 extended on-ramp for heavy commercial or slow-moving vehicles.
- Reconstruct the Clear Creek Greenway trail from the bottom of Floyd Hill to County Road 314.

Central Section

(middle of Floyd Hill to Hidden Valley)

Construction start: Early 2024





Central Section Overview:

- Improving access and operations at the I-70/US 6 interchange.
- Replace bridges at the bottom of Floyd Hill.
- Construct a new frontage road connection between the US 6 and Hidden Valley/Central City Parkway interchanges.

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CDOT Safety Efforts

- Incorporate emergency pull offs as part of project phasing.
- Traffic stops during blasting/scaling.
- Temporary protection fences during rock excavation work.
- Partner with emergency response agencies for quick clearance of incidents.
- Limit points of interaction between construction and public traffic.
- Barrier separation between construction workers and motorists.
- Coordinate with rafting companies and trail users to maintain safe passage and access.
- Reduce speed limits.
- Coordinate with CDOT Courtesy Patrol.
- Provide accurate and timely information to motorists and residents through text alerts, e-blasts and social media posts.

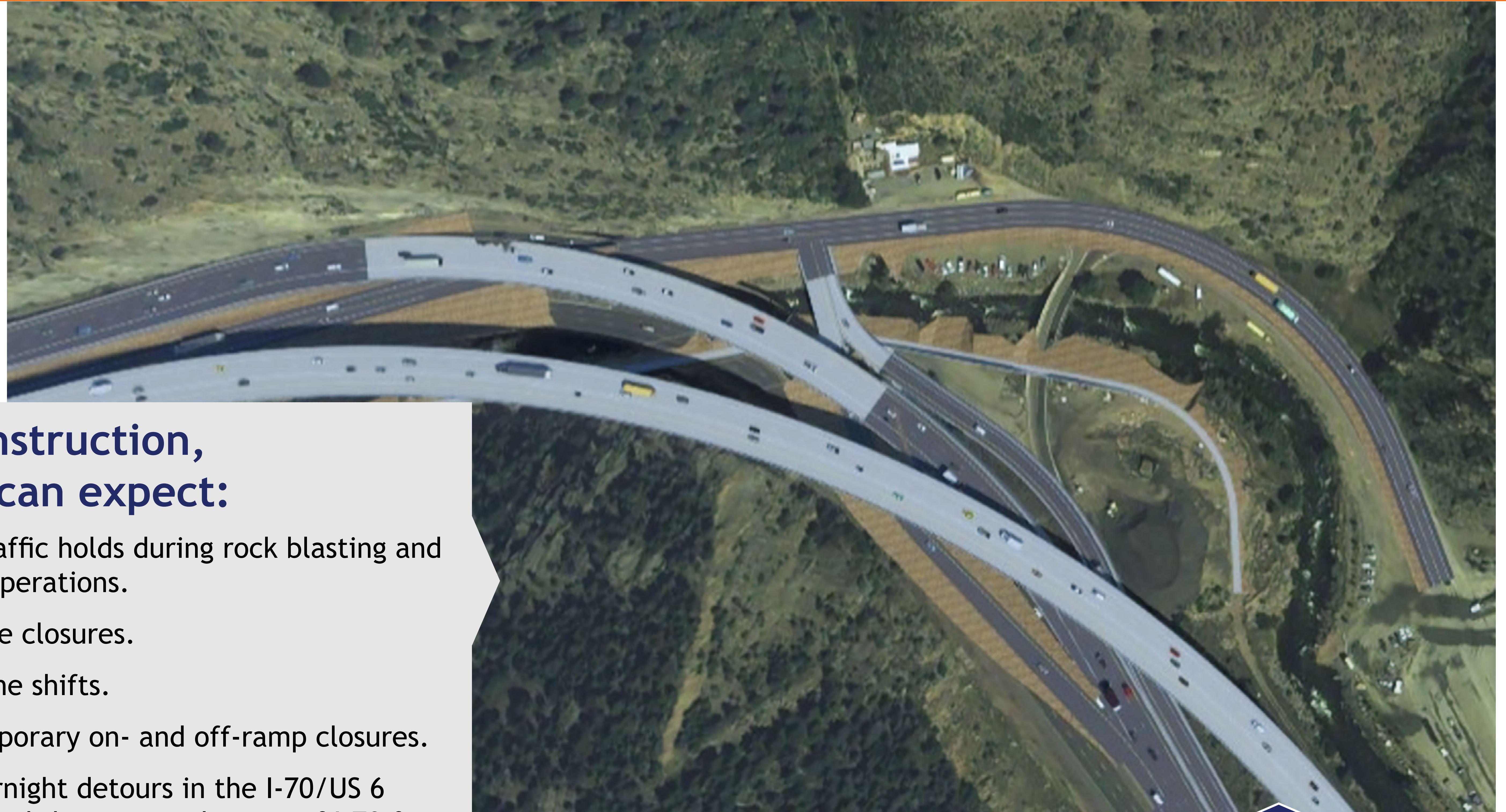




Efforts to keep I-70 moving during construction include:

- Keeping all lanes and ramps open during peak traffic times.
- Ensuring lane closures are responsive to current traffic patterns.
- Innovating complex work above the roadway so it doesn't impede traffic.
- Building new roadway sections adjacent to current lanes to keep traffic moving.

During construction, motorists can expect:

- Occasional traffic holds during rock blasting and rock scaling operations.
- Overnight lane closures.
- Temporary lane shifts.
- Periodic, temporary on- and off-ramp closures.
- Periodic, overnight detours in the I-70/US 6 interchange and short-term closures of I-70 for safety critical work.
- Temporary closures of the Clear Creek Greenway trail.

Rendering looking to the north. The westbound lanes of I-70 are elevated above the eastbound lanes at the bottom of Floyd Hill.

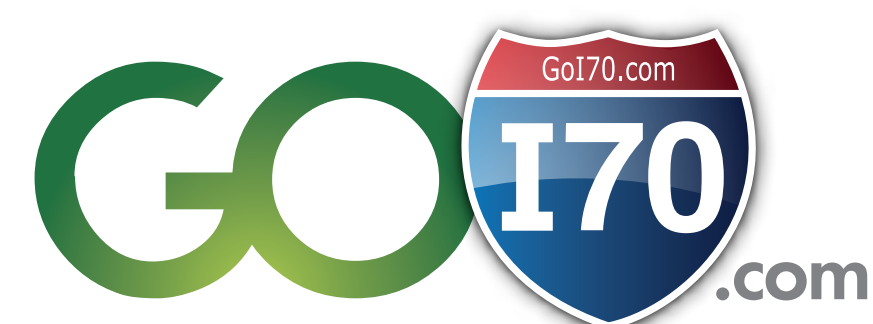


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Explore Better Travel Options
