Several factors will influence the number of pages dedicated to each theme.

- Importance of the themes in the corridor
- Likelihood of encountering resources in the corridor.
- Complexity of history.
- Whether other contexts already exist, and how well they apply to the corridor.

"Feature Type Descriptions" refers to descriptions of common architectural, engineering, and archaeological features that may be associated with a resource.

The outline for the historic contexts may change according to research and development.
