The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) are initiating an Environmental Assessment (EA) for the Interstate 70 (I-70) West Vail Pass Auxiliary Lanes project. The project limits include I-70 and the Ten-Mile Canyon National Recreation Trail from approximately mileposts 180-190. The purpose of the project, as currently defined, is to improve safety and operations on West Vail Pass. The I-70 Mountain Corridor Programmatic Environmental Impact Statement and 2011 Record of Decision identified construction of an eastbound and westbound auxiliary lane as necessary in this segment of the corridor. This EA will analyze potential impacts of this alternative to a finer level of detail and make final decisions regarding the scope of the improvement.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), in cooperation with the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT), is requesting formal consultation for the above referenced project.

The details of the project, consultation history and impact analysis are included in the attached Biological Assessment (BA). Based upon the potential direct, indirect, and cumulative impacts resulting from the project, the project *may affect, and is likely to adversely affect*, Canada lynx (*Lynx canadensis*). The project will have *no effect* on the other ESA-listed species identified in Table 7 of the BA.

Section 7(a)(2) of the Endangered Species Act of 1973 as amended (ESA) states that each Federal agency shall, in consultation with USFWS, ensure that any action they authorize, fund or carry out is not likely to jeopardize the continued existence of a listed species or result in the destruction or adverse modification of designated critical habitat. The attached BA requests a formal consultation with the USFWS on the potential impacts to Canada lynx as a result of this project. These actions will ensure that FHWA and CDOT comply with section 7(a)(2) of the ESA.

In December, 2019, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) submitted a Biological Assessment (BA) to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) to determine the effects the I-70 West Vail Pass Auxiliary Lanes Project (NHPP 0701-240, SA 21685) may have on federally listed species. An amendment to the BA was sent to your office on March 3, 2020, but included an incorrect version of the Amended BA. The correct version is attached.

Since the original BA, the U.S. Forest Service has updated their boundaries of the Lynx Analysis Units (LAUs) in the vicinity which resulted in the need to update the effects analysis for that species in the BA. Please accept the attached amendment which reflects that analysis. In addition there was a change to the project description removing reference to a concrete box culvert (CBC), The amended information does not alter the remainder of the project description or the effects determination from the December, 2019, BA.

FHWA would like to submit the attached amended BA and request formal consultation for the effects this project may have on the Canada lynx (Lynx Canadensis).
