PROJECT UPDATE

Westbound I-76 and York Street nightly closures scheduled for February 14, 2023

The Colorado Department of Transportation is making progress with replacing the I-76 bridges over York Street in Adams County. The next phase of construction will install westbound I-76 bridge girders that will support the driving deck. The work will require overnight road closures.

Traffic Impacts

- Westbound I-76 from 88th Ave. to I-270, and York Street at 66th Ave. are scheduled to be CLOSED 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Tuesday, Feb. 14.
- While work is being done at night to minimize traffic impacts, motorists should prepare for delays particularly on I-270. The York Street and I-76 closures under the bridge is necessary for public safety.
- The closure schedule could change depending on the weather and other factors. Go to COtrip.org for the latest information on traffic impacts and road conditions.

Detour Routes

- Westbound I-76 traffic will detour onto US 6-85 and I-270. Delays could be up to 20 minutes beyond typical night-time traffic conditions on I-270.
- A detour will be in place for York Street traffic from 66th Ave. west to Washington Street to 74th Ave. and back to York Street.

Remember: Slow for The Cone Zone

About the Project

The project will replace the aging I-76 bridges over York Street and reconstruct much of the driving surface on I-76 from York to Dahlia streets in Adams County.

Built in 1967, the I-76 bridges are deteriorating, requiring multiple repairs. They need to be permanently replaced for the long-term safety of the traveling public. Other roadway improvements, such as new pavement, will greatly improve the driving surface. Project completion is scheduled for September 2024.
