The Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) are conducting an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) to evaluate proposed improvements to the I-270 corridor. The improvements would address issues with traveler safety, travel time and reliability, transit, and freight operations on the I-270 corridor, and bicycle and pedestrian connectivity across I-270. The EIS is expected to be released at the end of this year (2025).

I-270 has limited pedestrian and bicycle crossings, making it difficult for residents to safely access destinations on either side. Improving safety and access for pedestrians and bicycles across the I-270 corridor is a central need of the project.

One project element currently being proposed is a pedestrian overpass of I-270, connecting the Rose Hill neighborhood to the Sand Creek Regional Greenway recreational, transportation, and nature corridor. The Sand Creek Regional Greenway Partnership (SCRGP) has been working directly with nearby communities to plan and design improvements to Commerce City Wetland Park. In the 2-mile-long-stretch, between Quebec Street and Vasquez Boulevard, there are no safe ways to cross I-270, and the project team explored multiple crossing types and locations to address this barrier. The location between East 53rd Way and Magnolia Street was identified to provide more community access to the Greenway. This has been identified as a community priority in planning by CDOT because of its location between pedestrian improvements at the Quebec Street and Vasquez Boulevard crossings of I-270.
