 - b.MOU established in April 2008
 - c. Primary Purpose to provide corridor-wide coordinated program of species and habitat conservation and provide the maximum benefit to wildlife.
 - b. Summit County Safe Passage



- a. This location does not have connectivity value for wildlife, but due to accidents wildlife fence is recommended as low cost mitigation.
- c. This project does not fall within a Linkage Interference Zone (LIZ)
 - a. Links habitat was discussed. It was noted links cross I-70 well west of the project and Dillon Reservoir impacts this. The area south of I-70 near Dillon Reservoir is not considered habitat.
- d. Mitigation
 - a. Wildlife Fencing from Exit 203 to Bridge over Blue River
 - b. FIR plans showed possible locations for Game Ramps
 - 1. Specification: Will require prelim layout and adjustment based on input from Michelle with CPW, Cinnamon CDOT, Cindy Ebert (USFS), Jordan Mead (Summit County)
 - c. Fence locations adjacent to trails
 - 1. Mishler Trail
 - a. USFS would have to make a formal decision on 'abandoning' or any realignment
 - b. Section 4(f) if the existing trail is relocated. The design of the Wildlife Fence can and will avoid the trail.
 - 2. Summit County Salt Lick Trail Extension
 - a. CDOT has coordinated with Summit County. Adjustments of FIR fence alignment and Summit County
 - 3. Town of Frisco Access to Water Tank Would require
 - a. Question about access from I-70. An access from I-70 to the water tank used to exist but has been closed. CDOT and FHWA indicated that the access will not be allowed because of interstate access criteria
 - 4. Game Ramps
 - a. CPW recommended 5.5' max height for jump down, and 3:1 ramp slope.
 Further design needed to determine if 3:1 slope will catch. Discussion on the center rail effectiveness, project will keep this.
 - b. Alternative game ramp designs were discussed including:
 - I-25 Gap Project Korby or Courtney Received
 - SH 13 Craig (Jenny) Received
- e. Additional Site Visit will be held in May/June depending on weather. Invite ITF team and include Cindy Ebert from USFS. Focus of site visit will be on the east side of I-70 between the scenic overlook and the overhead sign.
