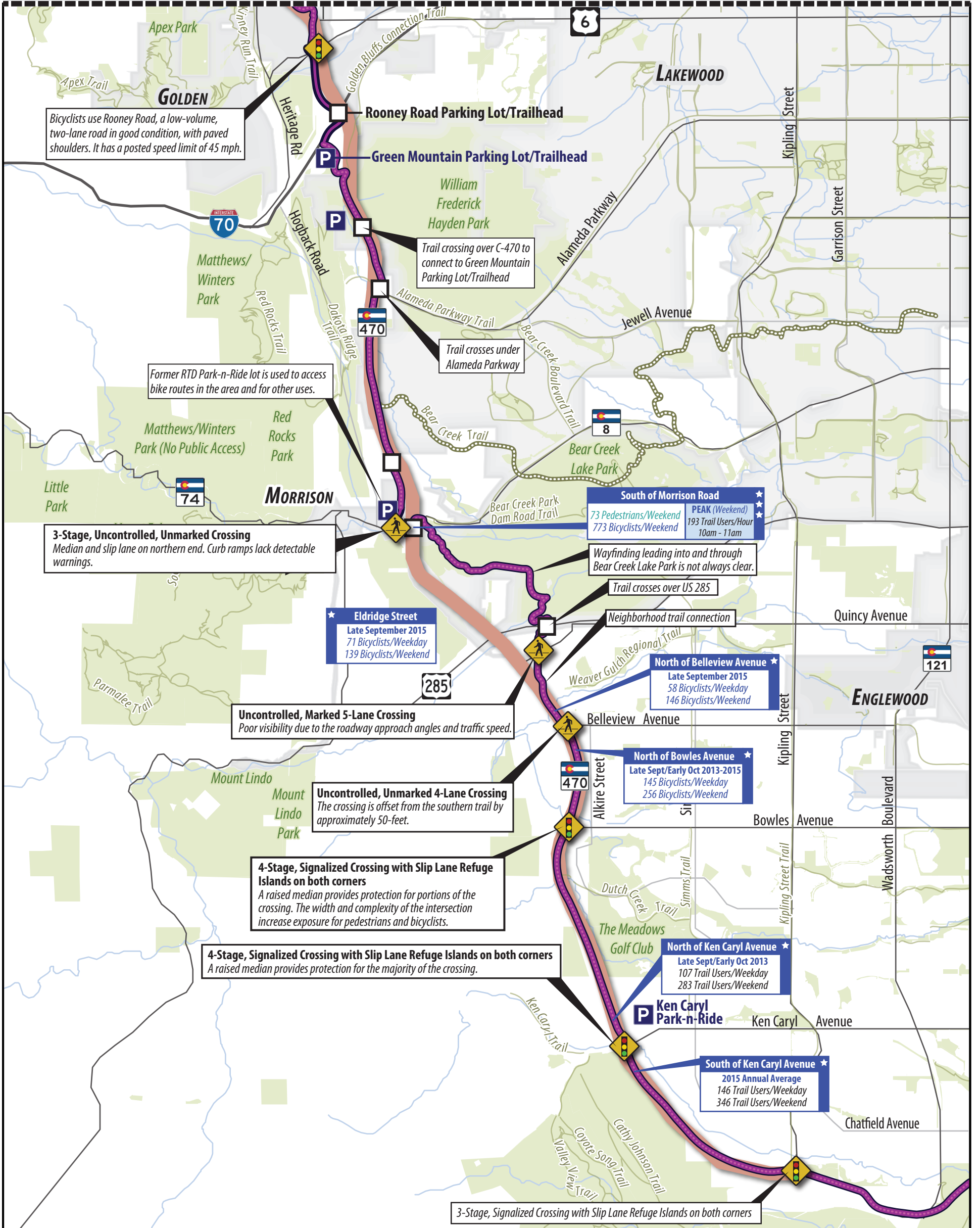

Bicyclists use Rooney Road, a low-volume, two-lane road in good condition, with paved shoulders. It has a posted speed limit of 45 mph.

Former RTD Park-n-Ride lot is used to access bike routes in the area and for other uses.

3-Stage, Uncontrolled, Unmarked Crossing
Median and slip lane on northern end. Curb ramps lack detectable warnings.

Uncontrolled, Marked 5-Lane Crossing
Poor visibility due to the roadway approach angles and traffic speed.

Uncontrolled, Unmarked 4-Lane Crossing
The crossing is offset from the southern trail by approximately 50-feet.

4-Stage, Signalized Crossing with Slip Lane Refuge Islands on both corners
A raised median provides protection for portions of the crossing. The width and complexity of the intersection increase exposure for pedestrians and bicyclists.

4-Stage, Signalized Crossing with Slip Lane Refuge Islands on both corners
A raised median provides protection for the majority of the crossing.
