

Historian Search

Project Name: U.S. 50 West PEL Study - Environmental Studies

Introduction

In February of 2011, WCRM completed a file search of the six corridors included in the U.S.50 West PEL study. These represent elements of the Pueblo Area Council of Governments (PACOG) Long Range Transportation planning study that are being examined as part of the U.S.50 West PEL studies. The study is examining a series of six street and highway corridors west of Interstate 25 (I-25) in the Pueblo metropolitan area for their use in improving local circulation in and around Pueblo by 2035. The studies are being done under the authority of the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) on behalf of the Federal Highway Administration (FHwA). CDOT and FHwA involvement in the project defined the action as a federal undertaking as per the provisions of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA). In addition, CDOT and FHwA authorization and approval of the proposed project will be subject to provisions of the National Environmental Protection Act (NEPA).

Project Description

The project studies will result in the use of one or more of the six corridors referenced above as well as U.S.50 west from I-25 to improve local and through traffic handling in Pueblo. The six corridors include the Pueblo Boulevard Extension, the Industrial Boulevard Extension, two separate extensions of Spaulding Avenue, the Tuxedo Boulevard Extension and the West Pueblo Connector. The total length of the corridors is approximately 33.22 miles. The plans involve the conversion of U.S. 50 west of I-25 into a four or six lane expressway as well as intersection improvements, and construction of new roadways. Presently, four alternatives (A-D) and the no action alternative are under consideration.

File Search Methodology

Two tasks were involved in searching the available cultural resource information for the U.S. 50 West PEL Environmental Studies project area. First, WCRM used shape files supplied by J.F. Sato and Associates to request listings of previously recorded sites and previous surveys within the 400 foot wide file search area for the corridors mentioned above. The request was submitted

to the Colorado Office of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (OAHP), the official repository of cultural resources records for the state. WCRM centered the 400 foot wide file search areas on the center line of the various corridors. In addition, following industry standard practices, WCRM included a mile to mile and one-half wide buffer around the corridors. The buffer data was segregated and not used in the information presented and summarized in this memorandum. The buffer data will be available for future reference and also assured that no sites would be truncated by the 400 foot file search areas. WCRM then used the lists of previously recorded resources and previous studies for the 400 foot corridors to search the OAHP's COMPASS online site records system. The information gathered there was combined with the GIS data and the results are presented in tables 1 and 2 and on maps 1 and 2 below.

File Search Results

The results of the file search are as follows:

- WCRM completed a cultural resource file search for the U.S. 50 West PEL Study Environmental Studies project area. The file search included 400 foot wide corridors centered on the centerlines of the six corridors (Pueblo Boulevard Extension, the Industrial Boulevard Extension, two separate extensions of Spaulding Avenue, the Tuxedo Boulevard Extension and the West Pueblo Connector). The search found 40 previously recorded sites and eight reports of previous studies. All of the sites proved to be associated with the Wet Pueblo Connector route.
- WCRM's buffered corridors file search identified 3,545 previously recorded sites and 74 previous studies. 1,020 of those resources do not have UTM or Public Land Survey location information, only addresses. WCRM did not attempt to sort the address-only resources because it will be a very time consuming process.
- WCRM found that all 40 of the resources relate to the historic period occupation of Pueblo and that three are historical archaeological sites.
- WCRM's search found that approximately 2.44 miles of the corridors have been covered by eight previous cultural resource surveys.

Mitigation

Mitigation measures cannot be proposed at this time because the lands where the new roads and freeways are to be built have not been completely inventoried for cultural resources. However, linear and block surveys that have been conducted along parts of the corridors resulted in the identification of two potential historic districts and 15 individually eligible or National Register historic district or linear resource contributing sites. Once the preferred alternative is selected, the intensive-level surveys are completed and determinations of National Register eligibility for all the resources are made, a plan to mitigate adverse effects to the eligible resources as a result of the proposed CDOT and FHwA actions relative to the U.S. 50 West PEL project will need to be developed and implemented before construction.

Conclusions and Recommendations

WCRM completed the tasks assigned to it by the Scope of Work dated February 7, 2011. The file search identified eight linear and block surveys that have been completed and that include 2.44 miles of the corridors used for the present U.S. 50 West PEL environmental studies and that more than 30 miles have not been surveyed. The file search also found 40 previously recorded sites that were all in the West Pueblo Connector corridor. No cultural resources have been previously recorded in any of the other corridors. All of the resources were historic in nature including three historical archaeological sites.

As a result of this study, it appears that little cultural resource work has been conducted within the U.S. 50 West PEL environmental studies area. Based on these considerations, it is anticipated that an intensive field inventory of the preferred alternative is likely to yield cultural resources from the historic period.
