


Project Fact Sheet I-25/US 50B Interchange Project

Project Overview

Work on the Interstate 25 and US Highway 50B Interchange Project began in December 2024. During construction, crews will build five new bridge structures, retaining and noise walls, roadway and ramp reconstruction, embankment, safety improvements, drainage and erosion control. Once complete, the interchange will be located just north of the current interchange and will operate as a Diverging Diamond Interchange, improving drivability and providing safer driving conditions for motorists. SEMA Construction is the prime contractor for the project.

The project is scheduled for completion in early summer 2027.

Project Schedule

- The project started construction in December 2024
- The project is scheduled for completion in early summer 2027.

Travel Impacts

Motorists and area residents can expect the following impacts during construction:

- CDOT and their contracting partner SEMA Construction are committed to keeping two lanes open in each direction on I-25 and one lane open in each direction on US 50 throughout the duration of the project.
- Single lane closures, ramp closures and shoulder closures will occur within the work zone during off-peak hours.
- Working hours are generally 30 minutes after sunrise to 30 minutes before sunset, Monday through Friday.
- Reduced speeds in the work zone are in place.
- Plan ahead and expect delays.
- Construction schedules are weather-dependent and subject to change. For current information on construction impacts, please check COtrip.org.
