

On roadways, when you see stoppped vehicles ahead in an adjacent lane—you must MOVE OVER one lane (if you can do so safely). If it's not safe to move over, you must SLOW DOWN.


Colorado's Move Over Law

COLORADO'S MOVE OVER LAW

Motorists must move over when passing an emergency, tow or maintenance vehicle working at, near, or in the roadway with its lights flashing.

If a driver is unable to move at least one lane away from the stationary vehicle, they must slow down to at least 25 miles per hour on roadways with a speed limit below 45 miles per hour.

On roadways with speed limits 45 miles per hour or more, motorists must slow down to 20 miles per hour less than the speed limit.





Those that fail to slow down or move over commit the crime of careless driving, a class 2 misdemeanor traffic offense that can result in up to 90 days in jail and a fine of up to \$300.
