

# COLORADO LAW – FOUR STAGES FOR KIDS



## Car Seats

COLORADO



Rear-Facing

Rear-facing child safety seat in the back seat until first birthday and 20 pounds.



Booster

Once child outgrows car seat with harness, use booster seat with vehicle lap and shoulder belt until eighth birthday.



Forward-Facing

Rear- or forward-facing child safety seat from first birthday and 20 pounds until the upper weight or height limit specified by the car seat manufacturer.



Seat Belt

Booster or vehicle seat belt from eighth birthday until sixteenth birthday.

**Children may remain in car seats and booster seats beyond stated age as long as they fall within the seat manufacturer's height and weight requirements for safety.**

**All safety seats should be installed and fitted according to the manufacturers' instructions and the vehicle owner's manual.**

Proper use of a booster seat and seat belt means the shoulder belt crosses the shoulder and chest (not the neck or face), and the lap belt lies flat across the upper thighs (not the stomach).

Parents and caregivers are responsible for properly restraining a child and will be ticketed if they fail to do so.
