Proper use of seat belt and booster means the shoulder belt crosses the shoulder and chest and the lap belt crosses the hips, touching the thighs.
A parent is responsible for properly restraining a child and will be ticketed if they fail to do soeven if they are not driving.

## 4 STEPS FOR KIDS - Colorado Law



IINFANT

حTODDLER


Rear-facing in child safety seat in the back seat until first birthday and 20 pounds

Rear or forward-facing in child safety seat from first birthday and 20 pounds until the upper weight or height limit of the car seat


حBOOSTER


ZSEAT BELT

Once child outgrows car seat with harness, use booster seat with vehicle lap and shoulder belt until eighth birthday

Booster or vehicle seat belt from eighth birthday until sixteenth birthday in all seating positions

Children may remain in car seats and booster seats beyond stated age as long as they fall within the seat manufacturer's installation and weight requirements for safety.
