NHTSA Region 8 Update:

- Joe Livingston, NHTSA Program Manager, Region 8:
 - Trafficsafetymarketing.gov provides free resources campaign that can be utilized in communities. Halloween campaign will have an alcohol and drug impaired focus this year.

- Journal of Accident Analysis and Prevention found that States with most restrictive laws and enforce them are more likely to reduce alcohol related crash fatalities.
- A scoping review of predictors of driving under the influence of cannabis (DUIC) in young drivers identified 9 predictors: being a male, high school senior, with lower grades, having a younger 'age of first cannabis use', a higher frequency of consumption, a reduced perception of danger, repeatedly binge drinking, a history of driving under the influence of alcohol and living with fewer parents.

Statistics, State Fatality Numbers:

- Glenn, Davis, CTFDID Chair - 413 fatalities so far this year in Colorado. As of August 2022, 140 people were killed by suspected impaired drivers on Colorado roadways.
- Dr. Cindy Stewart, CSP - shared Impaired Driving Citations and Impaired Crashes data. In June CSP covered 7 fatal crashes where alcohol and drugs are causal factors. There were 185 crashes that involved some sort of alcohol and impairment driving. In the same month, CSP issued 219 citations for alcohol only, 45 for alcohol & other drugs, and 25 for marijuana only. As August 18th, 2022, there were 48 crashes suspected to involve impaired driving and 58 fatalities. The numbers may change substantially as data are being investigated for accuracy.

Legislative Updates

- Captain Honn, CSP
 - Proposal for expanding Colorado Move Over Law to all passenger vehicles.
 - Proposal for commercial motor vehicle to revisit fine structure for intrastate that hasn't been touched in 20 years.
 - Bill proposal for driver license education access and affordability for additional driving hours for young drivers (18 years old).
 - MADD is looking for sustainable funding source for various programs, including high visibility drunk driving law enforcement.
- Tuesday Black, Vice Chair
 - Legislation:
 - BENTLEY'S LAW BILL SUMMARY

Under this bill, if a defendant is convicted of vehicular homicide due to intoxication or aggravated vehicular homicide and the victim of the offense was the parent of a minor child, then the sentencing court must order the defendant to pay restitution in the form of child maintenance to each of the victim's children until each child reaches 18 years of age and has graduated from high school, or the class of which the child is a member when the child reached 18 years of age has graduated.

This bill requires the court to determine an amount that is reasonable and necessary for the maintenance of the victim's child after considering all relevant factors, including, but not limited to:

- (1) The financial needs and resources of the child;
- (2) The financial resources and needs of the surviving parent or guardian of the child, including the state if the child is in the custody of the department of children's services; and
- (3) The standard of living to which the child is accustomed.

If a defendant who is ordered to pay child maintenance pursuant to this bill is incarcerated and unable to pay the required maintenance, then the defendant will have up to one year after release from incarceration to begin payment. If a defendant's child maintenance payments are set to terminate but the defendant's obligation is not paid in full, the payments will continue until paid in full.

This bill requires that no child maintenance be ordered if the surviving parent or guardian brings a civil suit and obtains a judgment prior to the sentencing court ordering child maintenance payments. If the surviving parent or guardian brings a civil suit and obtains a judgment after child maintenance payments have been ordered, then the child maintenance order will be offset by the amount of the judgment awarded in the civil action.

Media Relations and Upcoming Events

- Laura Sonderup:
 - Labor Day DUI enforcement period is running from August 17th – September 8th. CDOT is working with news media and social media channels to increase awareness and encourage people to plan ahead.
 - Office of communication is working with MADD on a special effort to target Colorado Springs with an awareness campaign in September.

Effectiveness Survey Outcomes

- CTFDID meetings will be offered in hybrid format.
- The Task Force will host a meeting in rural location at least once a year.
- CTFDID meetings will be scheduled for two hours and invite legislators to the meetings.
- Identify annual goals and develop subcommittees to achieve goals.
