### **Minutes of Previous Meeting:**

- Glenn Davis, CDOT
- Change in Secretary, MADD is now going to be Secretary position and funding with NHTSA,
  - Bring forward a motion to elect a new secretary and nominate Katie Contos
  - All in favor, no opposition
  - Katie Contos is now the Secretary.
- August Minutes approval
  - o Thank you, Tuesday, for help with previous meeting.
  - o Review of no September meeting and reasoning
  - o August Minutes were sent out, everyone received them.
  - o Motion to accept August minutes, no opposed.
  - Minutes accepted.

### **NHTSA Region 8 Update:**

- Gina Espinosa-Salcedo with Regional update
  - Recently released the fatality analysis, reporting system data sheet information. And there's several impaired driving facts that are included in that most recent report. Traffic safety facts for 2021, most recent data available, shown an increase in drug repair driving impaired, driving by alcohol and the number of children killed in at the crashes at the hands of an impaired driver. Statistics are now available on our website.
  - o Traffic Safety Facts 2021 Data: State Alcohol-Impaired-Driving Estimates (dot.gov)
  - o IACP International Association of Chiefs of Police took place in San Diego
  - DUI Court Academy in Fort Collins, Larimer County Justice Center

#### Statistics, State Fatality Numbers:

- Glenn Davis, CDOT
- Sarah Barkley, CDPHE
  - 524 crashes and 566 fatalities. This is a decrease from last year, but an increase from 2021.
  - Questions/Comments
    - Truman Bradley: What can we learn from this? Are there trends that are actionable? Is there a way to slice the data, would love to figure look at more granular data?
    - Sarah Barkley Response: Can get more specific location data in the crash report data. Have through early 2023 and that will give latitude and longitude of crashes. The CDOT engineers do that so we could get more specific location data. As far as a map. And then also one of my teammates here at CDPHE has developed. An alcohol outlet density map, any sort of liquor store or bar or restaurant that serves alcohol. Wanting to overlay that with either impaired, crashes, or maybe pedestrian evolved crashes.
    - Truman Bradley: Other states seeing a reduction? Who does it the best? Is there another State that has come up with other things?
    - Josh Downing Response: Four people working on for the last 5 years on website. How we can reduce the amount of time it takes a peace officer to process DUI. Finally, to the point where confident in the data that we have and we're producing to get good locations on impaired driving fatalities.

- Truman Bradley: Walk the process for what it takes to book a DUI and figure out where that could be improved and what the barriers are, is it a statutory barrier?
- Tuesday Black Response: Address later when discussing bylaws but used to have subcommittees and restoring them next year and can be tackled during working groups.
- Fran Lanzer: Regional Council of Governments Vision Zero Group has done a ton of work on mapping high injury network. All fatal traffic, crashes.
- Dave Fisher: Need cops on the ground, most agencies around, don't have enough to focus on DUI's.
- Rachel Reinhardt, CDSP
  - Only CSP data not Statewide
  - o Jan 1st to September 30th, lower number of injuries in fatal crashes
  - Month of September, dramatic drop in property crashes
  - o All together property decreased for 2023 from previous years.
  - Month of September (doesn't include property)
- Josh Downing: clarification Proactive -pre-crash, reactive-after crash
- Crystal Soderman, DOR/DMV:
  - There we are up over 50% for refusals for the last couple of months. We were trending down a little bit, but the last couple of months of spiked. We've been doing a lot of discussion around. What's happening? Why are the refusals happening?

  - o Report on HB17-1315

- Glenn Davis, CDOT HSO/Tuesday Black, CDOT:
  - o Impaired Driving Assessment-CDOT asked NHTSA Region 8 to arrange for assessment.
  - o Save-The-Date January 22<sup>nd</sup> -January 26<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
  - o Location: Omni Interlocken Hotel (500 Interlocken Blvd., Broomfield, CO 80021)
  - o Occupant Protection Assessment, Monday February 5<sup>th</sup>-February 9<sup>th</sup>, 2024, will be virtual.

- Glenn Davis, CDOT HSO/Tuesday Black, CDOT continued: Bylaws Update
  - Biggest change on them is New Chair would be elected at last meeting instead of first meeting.
  - Glenn Davis will not be running again.
  - New Vote-for Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary at November meeting
  - Moving to Quarterly meetings in 2024 (longer meetings 3-4 meetings); no dates set
  - However, to stay within rules, working groups, bi-monthly meetings will report out.
  - Fran Lanzer, MADD: want to have an August meeting to help with Grant end of year, annual report due at end of September, Legislators start working on bills, throughout year develop recommendations, and put together and sent out to Legislative in September, had legislative representatives come in July/August in the summer more available.
  - Tuesday Black: with NHSTA, need 6 different work groups (titles of sub-committees),
     thinking about if you can be NHSTA regional guideline number 8.
  - Quorum definition. Prior we were trying to have a quorum, moving forward proposed if you can't be in person/online provide a proxy.
    - Ed Wood: Suggestion on Sub-committee on Refusals
    - Tuesday Black: "sub-sub committees" can occur.
    - Allison Rosenthal: Second Ed's suggestion on Refusal
    - Tuesday Black: Another Executive Committee Member, Highway Safety Liaison
    - Fran Lanzer: Working on 6 topics, maybe difficult and maybe combine groups and reduce to 3 or 4.
    - Tuesday Black: At our discretion and if we have had same people attending, we can combine.
    - Paul Aylmer: How many subgroups?
    - Glenn Davis: 5 groups and groups within groups
    - Fran Lanzer: we must work on these 6 things but can add other groups as needed. Separate topic-in terms of members, can vacate positions if needed or create guidelines to vacate positions? There are folks that haven't been to a meeting in over a year.
    - Glen Davis: Page 3, Section 3 about absences. Very reluctant to vacate a state position.
    - Fran Lanzer: Section 3 Attendance at very end, last sentence. Do we need to define excessive?
    - Josh Downing: Leave it to the executive committees.
    - Glenn Davis: Advise be very careful taking off it, maybe a phone call.
    - Josh Downing: Phone call and let them know they can send a proxy to vote and identify when do introductions and can give updates.
    - Fran Lanzer: Not suggesting that but make clear expectations; maybe be position by position.
    - Tuesday Black: Will be creating a proxy form to keep record. Will have it out before January on website on CDOT's page.
    - Paul Aylmer: What is the purpose of proxy?
    - Glenn Davis: Someone be able to vote on behalf of my office and can only give it to my position.
    - Fran Lanzer: I represent a Victims Organization would I have to designate another Victims Organization?
    - Tuesday Black: Concern a lot of information is shared at meetings and proxy needs to understand information. We will work hard that voting opportunities are known in advance.

- Truman Bardley: We utilize proxy voting often; a voting member notifies me in writing via email or text and that a specific person has their proxy or a specific vote and have been other voting members and they vote as they see fit and then vote for the proxy. Would be supportive be of proxy voting and encourage this group to allow other voting members on this Task Group to be eligible to cast their vote.
- Fran Lanzer: Another model on liquor advisory group, the proxy member can include my opinion but after the meeting can vote on position in writing.
- Tuesday Black: Met with attorney to make sure compliance with the Open Meeting Act, want votes to be open within meeting. Do we want to table this for the November meeting and vote on Bylaws right now?
- Josh Downing: second what Glenn says. Would have time to give vote to another representative. Should be represent same group.
- Michelle Stone-Principato: Agree from DOR.
- Rebecca Green: We can define if you are state representative here is how you can
  do. And if you are not state representative this how you do, and this is an
  opportunity to build succession plans and write in. Vote on it on November
- o Glenn Davis: Motion to approve to Bylaws as written--No one responds.
  - Motion to redefine proxy and bylaws send out to group and vote in November.
  - Seconded by Paul Aylmer
  - No opposed
- Glenn Davis/Tuesday Black continued: Recommendations.
  - In May, solicited recommendations from larger stake holders' group, narrowed it down to 8.
  - o Present recommendations to group (6), vote on them at November meeting
