GRANT OVERVIEW

The grant funds are awarded to agencies, organizations, and tribal governments within the State of Colorado that provide programs, projects, services, and strategies that are intended to reduce the number of deaths and serious injuries resulting from traffic crashes on Colorado roads.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

- Colorado state agencies
- Federally recognized tribal governments
- Cities, counties, and their sub-agencies
- For Profit entities
- Non-profit entities with existing IRS 501 (c) (3) status

The proposed projects must impact at least one of the following core performance measures, year over year:

- C-1. Reduce the number of traffic fatalities
- C-2. Reduce the number of serious injuries in traffic crashes
- C-3. Reduce the fatalities per Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT)
- C-4. Reduce the number of unrestrained passenger vehicle occupant fatalities, all seat positions
- C-5. Reduce the number of fatalities in crashes involving a driver or motorcycle operator with a BAC of .08 and above
- C-6. Reduce the number of speeding-related fatalities
- C-7. Reduce the number of motorcyclist fatalities

- C-8. Reduce the number of unhelmeted motorcyclist fatalities
- C-9. Reduce the number of drivers age 20 or younger involved in fatal crashes
- C-10. Reduce the number of pedestrian fatalities
- C-11. Reduce the number of bicyclist fatalities
- C-12. Reduce the number fatalities involving a distracted driver
- C-13. Reduce the number of drivers 65 and older involved in fatal crashes (At Fault)
- C-14. Reduce the number of fatalities in crashes involving a driver or motorcycle operator testing positive for +> 5ng of Delta 9 THC

OVERVIEW OF FUNDING

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), aka Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), provides funding for this grant opportunity. This Act authorizes and provides funds for the federal surface transportation programs including highway safety programs. Applications must be able to identify a highway safety issue supported by data, establish baseline and evaluation measures and detail how the project will influence one or more of the core performance measures.
