- 3. National Scenic Byway Foundation Update (5 minutes)
 - a. Lenore Historic Roads Conference Sept 26-28, 2014, Savannah GA Pending Nominations (15 minutes) –
- 4. Durango/Chama Byway -
 - Roxanne Meeting in June 2014 was a 3 caravan tour; Chris Sporl at the conference suggested adding Chimney Rock as a spur off the byway; 124.5 miles long with the spur; nomination has been drafted; working on the conceptual plan;
 - b. Q Roger: Who would make up the board (who/what), partners, etc.?
 - c. A Steve: Working on the networking side, we are corresponding with 100 people, identified resources, Durango RR, Cumbres Toltec RR, Navaho State Park, Counties, Chama Village 9 organizations
 - d. Q Georgi: When do you expect to submit?
 - e. A Roxanne: By the end of this month a nomination and conception, last nomination is Collegiate Peaks, around 35 pages, conceptual plan will give the next steps; Steve: We need more substantial information before moving forward, a Byways Commission Tour possibly on Oct 2-3-4 or Oct 9-10-11, will send out a doodle poll to the Commission to determine next steps
 - f. Q Cynthia: Are you preparing letters of support, a feasibility study, an action plan for PR, how are you going to staff the byway, letter from Lieberman
 - g. Q Roger Cover a variety of topics, including scenic, historic, agritourism, pullouts, etc.
 - h. Q Sen. Nicholson: Can you review the route?
 - i. A Dan: The unpaved road between Dulce and Hwy 151 is drivable most of the time by 2WD, but requires high clearance or 4WD at times
 - j. Q Georgi: make sure your materials state the road type
 - k. Q Roger: Is there a viability of that portion of the byway?
 - 1. A Steve: From Dulce to Gato, you can see the RR along this portion of the route, major features of the RR

- m. Q Kelly: Earthen portion is suggested as 4WD?
- n. A Dan: We recommend that this stretch is improved for safety
- o. Lenore will review the draft nomination (Also share it with a few Commissioners)
- p. Q Bob: What about the NM contact?
- q. A Roxanne & Steve: We have support from NM, but need to see how they will handle this extension, traffic count is 29 vehicles per day.
- r. Q Roger: Request that a letter of support be added from NM $\,$
- s. A Dan: A letter from this commission could be sent to NM to assist with the NM support/designation
- t. Dan stated that part of reason the designation is preservation, since some items have been taken. Also gives property owners the ability to direct their future. A major stakeholder is Southern Utes.
