Although the shortest of Colorado's Scenic and Historic Byways, "The South Platte River Trail" in the extreme northeastern corner of the state is long on history. In the 19th century it lay on the main route westward and was traveled by tens of thousands of pioneers lured by the promises of wealth, land and freedom.

Beginning at the Colorado Welcome Center on I-76 at Julesburg, this 19-mile loop traverses parts of the old Overland/California and the Pony Express trails as well as the routes of the first Transcontinental Telegraph, Railroad and automobile road.

Herds of buffalo, that sustained the Native Americans, thrived on the lush prairie grasses as they roamed the Platte River Valley for centuries.
